Learning Objectives for Khmer – Grade 1

At the completion of Grade 1, learners should be able to:

Basic Language Comprehension

- Arrange the vowels in order
- Understand the difference between, and proper use of consonants and vowels, including beginning to blend them together
- Understand the concept of converting the sound of some consonants by using ្គ and ្ឃ

Listening

- Identify the sound of the 33 consonants and 23 vowels
- Recognise the different sounds of the two consonant groups (អ and អី)
- Identify the sound of simple words with consonant, vowel and consonant pattern
- Listen attentively to stories and retell the main idea
- Show respect when others are speaking and wait their turn to speak
- Follow simple instructions
- Identify different blending sounds

Speaking

- Correctly pronounce the consonants and vowels
- Blend consonants and vowels
- Speak in complete and correct sentences
- Learn simple songs

Writing

- Correctly form the consonants and vowels
- Complete simple word dictation with correct spelling
- Copy simple text from the board or book

Reading

- Recognise the written consonants and vowels
- Sound out simple words with consonant, vowel and consonant pattern
- Read familiar short texts
- Begin to recognise basic blending

Learning Objectives for English – Grade 1

At the completion of Grade 1, learners should be able to:

Listening

- Recognise the different sounds of all consonants
- Listen attentively to a story and know some details
- Show respect when others are speaking and wait for a turn
- Follow 2-3 step instructions

Speaking

- Use correct pronunciation
- Speak clearly and audibly
- Express ideas in simple sentences
- Participate in simple discussions about various topics
- Use an expanding vocabulary to express themselves
- Ask and answer specific questions
- Recite short poems, rhymes, songs, tongue twisters and verses

Writing

- Correctly form upper and lower case letters
- Copy text from the board or books with correct spelling
- Recognise some simple sight words
- Write from left to right in a uniform manner
- Use proper spacing between words

Reading

- Read copied text
- Recognise some common sight words
- Blend consonant sounds
- Identify beginning, middle and end sounds
- Comprehend simple text that is read by an adult

Learning Objectives for Mathematics – Grade 1

At the completion of Grade 1, learners should be able to:

Number Sense

- Read and write Khmer numbers up to 100
- Compare the size of objects
- Understand the 4 processes of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division
- Recognise the relationship between addition and subtraction number facts
- Understand that multiplication is repeated addition
- Count forward and backward to 100
- Order numbers in sequence to 100
- Compare numbers to show greater than and less than, up to 100
- Regroup objects to show the same sum in different ways
- Skip count number families 2, 3, 5 and 10

Computation

- Add and subtract single digit numbers
- Add one digit plus two digit numbers without carrying
- Subtract one digit numbers from two digit numbers without borrowing
- Use addition and subtraction facts up to 12
- Solve problems with all 4 processes using manipulatives

Geometry, Patterns and Forms

- Recognise, draw and name the basic shapes - square, rectangle, circle and triangle
- Clap and step out number patterns
- Recognise and extend number patterns and forms
- Identify positions in space - right, left, over, under, in front, behind, up and down

Learning Objectives for Social Sciences – Grade 1

Social science topics are presented in various lessons throughout the year, both in Khmer and English. They may be specific lessons or included in classes such as cooking, gardening, drama and movement. This includes life lessons that are practical, interesting and help children build skills they will use every day for years to come. Social sciences in the early grades is centred on the experience of interacting with the world and each other to develop social awareness and an understanding of accepted norms. When subjects are presented in more depth in later grades, children already have an understanding and connection to the way the world works and their place in it.

At the completion of Grade 1, learners will be able to:

Social Sciences

- Introduce and talk about themselves, members in the families and other relatives
- Show respect for others and their space, the school and natural environment and materials
- Understand right from wrong and accepted behaviours
- Demonstrate the basics of plant care
- Know familiar wild and domesticated animals and their behaviours
- Understand that objects have different qualities (hot, cold, hard, soft, sharp, blunt)
- Practise good hygiene and safety habits, especially in cooking class
- Describe daytime and nighttime and know their differences
- Give examples of some types of weather and different seasons
- Describe what they observe in nature, both the plant and animal world
- Complete craft projects especially connected to festival celebration
